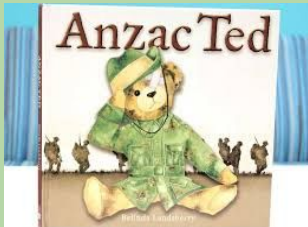

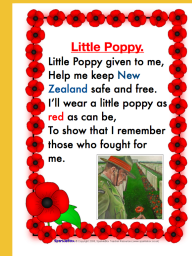

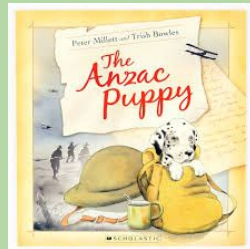

Can you find out why we wear poppies? Why is the poppy a symbol for ANZAC day?



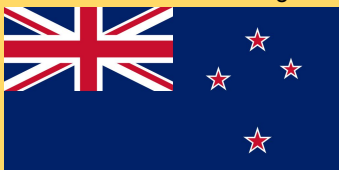
How many red things can you find in your house? Can you make a big poppy out of all of those red things?
