One of our guiding principles that is starting to shape our school is the idea of Whakapapa.



Internet Health and Wellbeing Presentation for the Hillcrest Kāhui Ako Community with John Parsons

We are very fortunate to have John Parsons, New Zealand's leading authority on safeguarding children online and author of 'Keeping Your Children Safe Online', visiting our area later in September. John will be holding a community workshop for parents and whānau from our Hillcrest Kāhui Ako between 7.00 and 8.00pm on the evening of 20th September at the Tamahere





Community Hall. The Community Workshop is on **Raising Resilient Capable Children** and will focus on **cyber safety** for our tamariki. The cost is \$5.00 per person. The workshop will:

- → Identify the specific challenges children face when using ICT.
- → Include guidance on behaviour management processes for parents in the practical situations they will face.
- ⇒ Empower parents to take responsibility for safeguarding their children/tamariki.
- Provide tools to support our children/tamariki in how to use ICT safely and ethically at home and at school.
