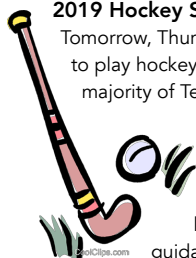

Measles Immunisations Reminder

- Measles can be a serious disease which is caused by a virus. It is very easy to catch and immunisation is the only way to prevent measles.
- Parents are encouraged to make sure their children's immunisations are up to date – catch up immunisation is free.
- If you're unsure about whether your child has had MMR immunisation, or you can't find your records, you can check with your Well Child Tamariki Ora provider or Well Child book, or contact your family doctor. Combined measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) immunisation is the only vaccine available to prevent measles in New Zealand.
- Please ensure people who may be infectious – whether it be measles, 'flu, gastro, or something else to stay home in isolation so they do not pass whatever they have on to others until they are well (or cleared to return)
- Remember hand hygiene and cough/sneeze etiquette.
