We gain knowledge from new information and the world around us, but we also learn from each other. One of the beautiful aspects of being in a diverse school such as ours is we have people with many different experiences, view points and ideas that we can learn from. As mentioned in the whakatauki above - people are our most important resource! There is so much we can learn from each other and how much better would our world be if we could all appreciate what it is like to walk in other's shoes. A way we go about growing the principle of Ako in school is with our Tuakana - Teina time. Once a week, our older children (tuakana) buddy up with our younger ones (teina) for combined learning. It is wonderful to see such collaboration and reciprocity in learning as the students help each other and share their learning journey together.

A big THANK YOU to all the parents and whānau who came to school last night and took part in the junior information evening. It was great to see so many people there, invested in the learning of their children and wanting to be part of their learning journey - awesome! Last night was a great example of our principles of Kaupapa - creating a collaborative and shared vision for learning with our community, and Ako - our whole school community learning from each other, learning together. Throughout the night we heard from literacy expert Ann Beckitt (Resource Teacher for Literacy based at our school) who shared around our new phonics programme. This active, discovery and language rich programme has been developed specifically for our school and based on the needs of our learners. Louise Morgan, Melanie Freeman and Sandra Edwards also presented on the play based

approach we are developing throughout our junior school. We heard about the research behind the approach, examples of play based learning in action, how it ties together so many aspects of the New Zealand Curriculum as well as fostering creativity, curiosity, problem solving and the development of social skills. There will be more opportunities in the future to hear from our amazing team about aspects of learning at Silverdale - so please watch this space!
