Reports and Learning Conversations

This year we are making a change to the way we report to parents. From feedback we received from our community, it was clear that caregivers felt that a conversation was a more informative way of discussing progress than simply reading a school report. For the mid-year reporting this year we have scheduled Learning Conversations in week 2 of next term on Tuesday 30th July, and Wednesday, 31st July - more details including how to book coming later. At these interviews you will be given a written summary of learning to date and talk about goals for the remainder of the year. We believe this will be a far more useful method of reporting and aligns more strongly with our principle of Kaupapa - creating a shared vision for learning together.

Early Closure for Learning Conversations

To create more available times for whānau to book for our Learner Conversations, we have decided to close at **lunchtime** on **Wednesday 31st July**. This will enable caregivers to book interviews from 1.30pm on this day.

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Home Communication

We have also been listening to community voice around communication. As facebook and the school app have been identified as more timely forms of communication, we have decided to publish newsletters on a fortnightly cycle (every even week). Hockey draws and other weekly information will be published on our website, facebook page and via the school app.
