We had a large number of excellent candidates standing for the Board this year, and I would like to thank you for putting your names forward. I would also like to thank all the community members who voted in the elections. I am excited to start working with this new board in plotting our way forward as a school.

Enrolment Scheme

Silverdale Normal School has been going from strength to strength. We've been growing too - new families have been joining us regularly and the word is out in the community that Silverdale is the school to be at! Due to this growth, the Ministry of Education has approached our school to discuss an enrolment scheme (school zone). With a scheme in place we would be able to better manage enrolments and keep our school from growing to the point of overcrowding. An enrolment scheme means that all homes that are within the school zone will be able to enrol in our school. Those living outside of the zone will be able to enrol as part of the ballot system - giving priority to certain groups (e.g. siblings of existing students etc). Please note: this will not affect existing students (or their siblings) who are living out of zone - this will only affect new enrolments.

With the guidance of the Ministry, our Board of Trustees agreed upon a proposed zone. This has been passed by all the Boards of Trustees of surrounding schools who have agreed to our proposal. The next step is to enter into community consultation. We'd like to hear your voice! Please take time to consider the proposed zone and fill out the form that can be found on our school website and facebook page, or head into the school office - you are welcome to fill in the form there. We will collate our community's thinking around the zone and use this information to add to the final decision.

Notes on the proposed enrolment scheme:

Currently, Hillcrest Normal School's zone extends along Silverdale Road. The Ministry of Education has suggested that the area of land between Silverdale Road and Hillcrest Road/Cambridge Road/Morrinsville Road become a shared zone - i.e. families living here will be zoned for both Hillcrest and Silverdale.



Being the last school in the area to be zoned, it is Ministry policy to "fill in the map" up to the borders of the other zones

- that way no homes are left without a zoned school to go to. A sheet outlining the proposed zone accompanies today's newsletter.
